How he copes with the situation and, in doing so, discovers in Cyrenne a person as lonely and in-secure as himself, is the comedy and pathos of Rattle of a Simple Man.

Percy makes fine

'Simple Man'

(RATTLE of a Simple Man," a Garrison Players' production, opened at the City Hall Theatre last night, and runs until Friday.

The "rattle" belongs to middle-aged, north-country soccer fan, Percy, who is 'Up for the Cup' in London, and, more to the point, 'Down from the Mill'.

After the match, Percy gets sloshed, and with the lads dances "in a ring round Eros" (the statue), and having bet his chum Ginger that he'll . . . well, you know . . that evening, he proceeds to bumble in unsteady circles around another Eros, in the shape (not a bad one) of a lonely and unhappy prostitute named Cyrenne.

Percy, a virgin scoutmaster, well played by Mike Clarke; he strikes just the right note of false bravado — "I've seen hundreds of women" balanced with common sense and naivete, honesty and unconscious hypocrisy.

He is a failure with women, and so invents little protective lies, such as boasted dancing ability.

But when relaxed, he (including the original untalks of the "mill" and the flushable bog). He deserves "lads", and even tries a so tull houses. — Simon Ellis.

ERICA Bridgman's Cyrenne, though good, was a shade too motherly, I thought, and her angry speeches don't quite carry the bitterness they should.

the bitterness they should. Cyrenne doesn't care a pig's bottom for anyone, and Percy can hang himself in his Lancashire cotton drawers for all she cares.

Gradually, she does come to care, but anger and despair are never far away, and the message still has to be rammed past Saint Percy's halo: "I'm no different to anyone else".

Cyrenne, too needs to invent an imaginary life, (she has slopped in a cafe, and was raped by her stepfather) and a very complete life of brigadiers, butlers, and halcyon Oxford days is exposed when Percy at last tumbles. Erica Bridgman is at her best here.

In all, Geoffrey Eden has given us an enjoyable production, with good scenery, lighting and sounds off (including the original unflushable bog). He deserves full houses. — Simon Ellis.


ERICA PLAYS HER ROLE AS A 'CALL GIRL'

THE GARRISON Player's third production of the theatre season, and the first for 1970, opened on Tuesday night at the City Hall with Charles Dyer's Rattle of a Simple Man.

Already made into a movie version, the local production was undertaken by Geoffrey Eden who deserves credit for a job well-done.

The three main roles went to Erica Bridgman as Cyrenne the prostitute, Mike Clarke as Percy the shy, and David Simpson as Ricard, Cyrenne's brother.

This is Erica's third debut on Hongkong stage, but not quite up



As Percy, Mike Clarke is very good. His naturalness for the part is well conveyed to the audience who are forever kept in stitches.

As a shy inexperienced man who accepts his friend's bet to go home with Cyrenne, he comes on like a gangbuster, but unfortunately, neither he nor Erica bring much pathos to their parts.

Mike has not overdone it this time as in "The Anniversary", but has instead, brought light to the fact that he is very well suited to the "Percy" sort of role.



David Simpson is a natural except when he reddens. As Ricard, Cyrenne's brother, he plays his part flawlessly, and is a valuable asset to the Players.

"Rattle of a Simple Man" is a story which was intended as a comical, pathos-ridden play going into the lives of two completely different people; a prostitute and a shy man of 42, yet relating the loneliness and lives of the two.
