MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Welcome everyone to Snow White!!

On behalf of my cast, crew, production, creative and technical teams, we are thrilled to have you here to join in the fun of yet another HK Players panto extravaganza!! We are assuming you are full of energy and not feeling remotely knickered! — ooops — sorry Dame Cabbage, stole your line! — meant to say knackered! (adults note: there is a bar!!! So get there in the interval if you've missed it). And DON'T sit back and pretend to enjoy the show whilst grabbing a quick 40 winks, but instead feel free to sing along, dance along and laugh A LOT!!! — then you may get some sweets thrown at you!!! You lovely audience members are a crucial part of our show — the cast rely on you to join in the fun just as much as you rely on them to entertain you!!! As I remember saying last year — I try to capture every audience member from age 5 to 95!!!!

So this is my second time directing the panto for the HK Players'. After the Aladdin experience last year, I was thrilled and honoured to be given the opportunity to direct the panto for the Players again. I've had some interesting experiences as a panto director in the past where the vision just hadn't been fully realised – for example, with another company who will remain anonymous, due to an ill-timed haircut Rapunzel had to be imprisoned in a bungalow!






CAST - THE DWARVES


Luke Ackerman as Dwarf Doshus
